- Musicking as an expression of communities' needs, desires, hopes, ideals and identity
- Principal values: Safety, Inclusion, Creativity,
 Participation, Cultural Democracy,
 Empowerment, Quality in Process and Result

Master Course: Inclusive Musicpedagogy/ Community Music

- Founded in 2017 at the Catholic
 University Eichstätt-Ingolstadt under the chair of Prof. Dr. Daniel Mark
 Eberhard and developed and carried out by Prof. Dr. Alicia de Banffy-Hall
 - Unique course of studies in Western Europe with the aim to train and educate Community Musicians practically and academically



Service Learning Experience

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- In their third term, students get to develop, plan, realize and evaluate their own community music project. This music project by definition should have community oriented goals, such as
 - granting access to cultural activities
 - self-expression and empowerment
 - bringing different or heteregenous populations together (intergenerational, special-needs, intercultural etc.)



• The methodology and principles behind the project is inclusive and stresses cultural democracy.

Learning Objectives

- Gaining the experience of creating and realizing their own music project in the framework of their studies.
- Gaining concrete skills in project planning and execution: organizational and didactic skills, experience in cooperation with partner organizations, competences in PR, evaluation tools and communication.
 - Learn about personal strengths and weaknesses
 - Leaving university with a portfolio that will increase credibility and trust in the student's ability for future potential



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- A community music orchestra in Ingolstadt for anyone interested in playing music with others and without any musical prerequisites, in collaboration with a local service for young migrants.
 - Weekly music and theatre sessions for anyone interested in a vacant train station building. In this project, over the course of 5 months, people could freely (and without cost) join these creative sessions.
- A choir for homeless people that still exists today.
